HOW DO I GET MY BADGES?

Ask your Scout or Guide leader to run the Challenge in your unit / group. Even if you don't take part as a group, you can still complete the Challenge at home or your local library to qualify for the badge. When you tick the box to say you are a Scout or Guide you will qualify for your badge. Then just give your Certificate of Achievement to your Scout or Guide leader.







Complete any 4 activities to earn your badge! You'll need internet to complete this activity unless your Unit Leader downloads and prints one of the unplugged activities.







Younger scouts and guides might like to try Early Learning Unplugged (this is a downloadable activity that needs to be printed and just uses crayons, paper and dance!).
